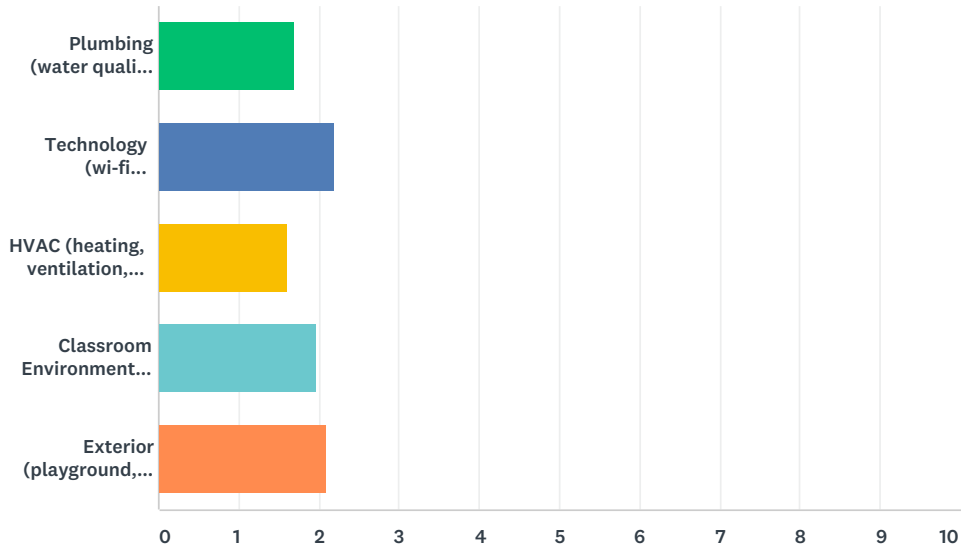

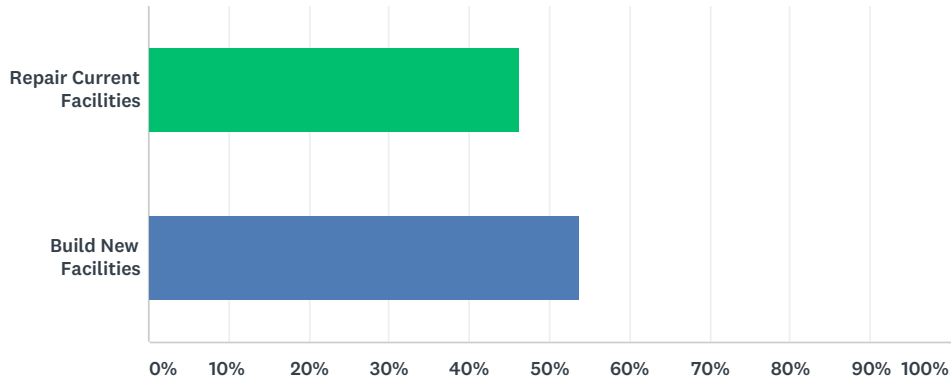

| 21 | As a speech pathologist currently at the Middle School, I feel it absolutely necessary for there to be adequate space for ALL therapy services, including speech therapy. Prior to the recent construction of the Middle School, I advocated for the need of a private, quiet space that could accommodate 3-4 students and one adult for speech therapy (In addition to the space that was already occupied by the building SLP). I communicated with the principal at CMMS about the need, attended an after school meeting with the architect to make my needs known, and brought it up with the SPED director at the time, throughout the planning process. I was assured I'd have a space. To make a long story short, I did not. I was told the space that was planned for me was converted into another room because there was not enough classroom space. I currently share a room with OT and PT who are both part time in the building, which means this year I am left hunting for a space to do therapy with students every Wednesday. My options are one of the four glass walled, small group spaces IF they are available. These rooms are problematic for many reasons including the fact that middle schoolers aren't always thrilled to be seen with the speech therapist (there is NO privacy in these spaces and anyone walking down the hall or in adjacent classrooms can see everyone in the room), and many of my students have ADHD and have difficulty focusing on the lesson when people are passing and other distractions are happening in the hallway. With the elementary building merging as the Sixth Grade Center did with the Middle School, we must consider that multiple speech paths will need their own, quiet, private spaces. Bare minimum should include a small room, big enough for a teacher desk, a table which can accommodate 4-5 people, a file cabinet, a white board. A large shared closet for therapy materials and test materials in approximation to the offices would also be recommended. Please, Please, Please, consider everyone's needs when working on the buildings plans. We may be a small group within a much larger establishment, but we too, must have the basics in order to do our jobs well. 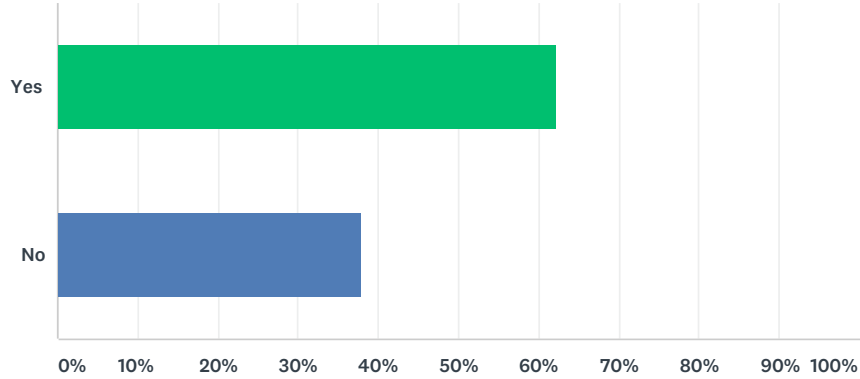

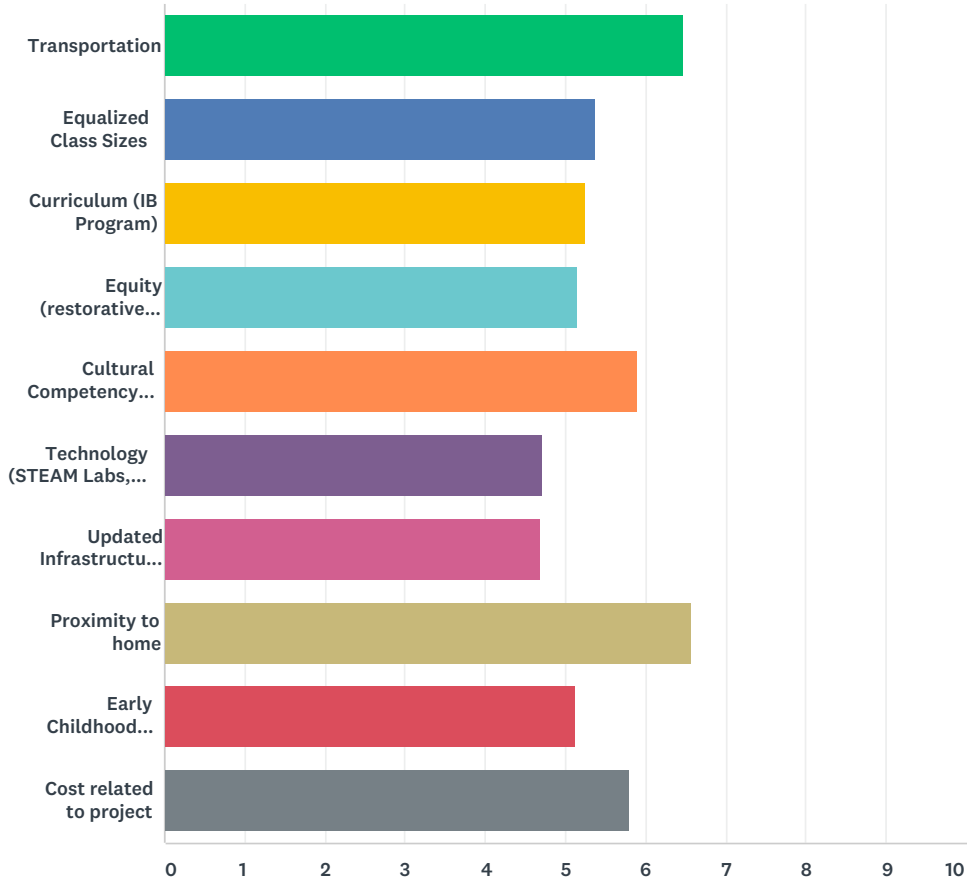

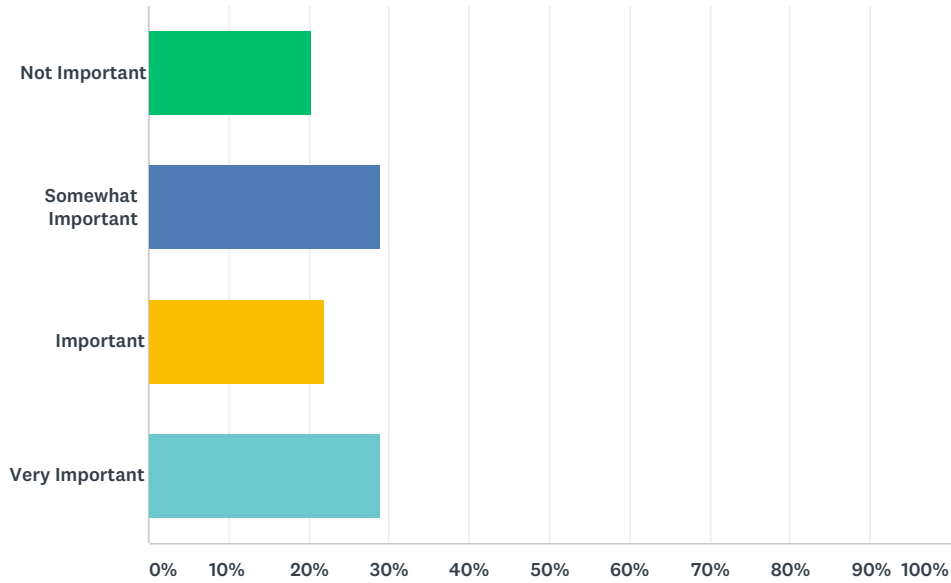
